## **Brunswick Pipeline and Rockwood Park Consultative Committee to host Open Houses, Oct. 29 and 30, 2007**

**SAINT JOHN, NB:** Brunswick Pipeline and the Rockwood Park Construction and Restoration Consultative Planning Committee will host two Open Houses next week to present plans for the construction and the restoration and walking/bicycle trail design in Rockwood Park.

The input collected from participants who attended the October 4 public workshop provided insight into community interests and concerns. From that, the Committee is now prepared to present the Rockwood Park plan and designs.

The Open Houses will be held:

“The Rockwood Park public workshop participants brought us their concerns and ideas around Rockwood Park construction, restoration of the pipeline right of way and trail development,” said Mike MacIntyre, Brunswick Pipeline general manager and committee co-chair. “We have pulled these comments together with environmental and geotechnical data and construction processes, and are excited to bring to the public a proposal that we believe addresses the concerns.

“For the Saint John Horticultural Association, our greatest hope is that we are able to provide users of Rockwood Park with an accessible trail experience that will be enjoyed for years to come,” said Ian Stead, President of the Horticultural Association and Committee co-chair. “We believe that the proposed plan and walking/bicycle trail will tie into our other plans for Park and provide a base on which to build future developments.”

The Rockwood Park Construction and Restoration Consultative Planning Committee includes representatives from Brunswick Pipeline, the Saint John Horticultural Association, City of Saint John, Atlantic Coastal Action Program Saint John, a resident of the Rockwood Park area, a resident-at-large, and the NB Department of Environment’s Compliance Officer. BDA Landscape Architects joined the Committee in August after being hired to develop the overall design for the pipeline route restoration and associated trail development plan.
