Brunswick Pipeline Receives NEB Approval for Construction

Halifax, NS: Yesterday, the National Energy Board (NEB) gave its approval for Brunswick Pipeline to begin construction of its 30-inch, 145 km natural gas pipeline. In its release, the NEB stated that it is satisfied that "all conditions required to be met prior to commencement of construction" are met and that construction can now begin.

"This is great news," said Robin McAdam, President of Brunswick Pipeline. "Our contractor, Louisbourg Pipelines, is ready. They are organizing their manpower and equipment to begin clearing tomorrow or Monday, November 19. "

Equipment will be delivered to rural areas outside of St. Stephen today. Clearing will begin there, working in an easterly direction.
