

Clearing will begin in Saint John next week

Clearing will begin on sections of the urban 30-metre right-of-way (ROW) next week. Equipment will be moved to several start-up areas beginning today and clearing crews are expected to begin work on Monday, December 10, 2007.

Clearing includes tree cutting and stump removal, and establishment of watercourse, wetland and run-off protection measures. Work will begin in the Milford area, in Rockwood Park, and near Forbes Drive working northward toward Boars Head Road and westward toward Belleview Avenue.

NJ Industries, a First Nations firm based in the Eel Ground band, has been hired as the subcontractor for urban clearing. NJ Industries is a partnership of individuals from several First Nation communities, and will employ 10-12 First Nation People along with some non-native staff.

Media advisories will be issued as construction progresses. In addition, for Rockwood Park, notices will be posted at the Lily Lake Pavilion and Rockwood Park Interpretation Centre prior to work that will impact trail usage.
