

Brunswick Pipeline Project Update

Brunswick Pipeline is pleased to report that the 145 km natural gas pipeline is very close to completion. While wetter than normal weather has been a challenge since summer, our contractor deployed additional manpower and equipment to complete construction. At the peak of construction in early October approximately 750 personnel were employed, and more than 700 workers were maintained by the contractor from mid-August to the end of October. Mechanical completion will occur in January 2009. Right-of-way (RoW) clean-up and restoration activities will resume in approximately June 2009 and will continue through the summer.

New General Manager: Brunswick Pipeline is pleased to announce the appointment of its new, Saint John based General Manager, Rob Belliveau. A resident of Quispamsis, NB, Rob joined the Brunswick Pipeline team on December 15, 2008. He is a graduate of St. Francis Xavier University with a Diploma in Engineering and, obtained a B. Eng. (Chemical) from the Technical University of Nova Scotia. Rob began his career in the energy sector and brings more than twenty-five years experience in process operations and control, management and customer service. Rob is a sports and fitness enthusiast, and active in the community. He coaches minor hockey and baseball, and is a member of the Board of the Kennebecasis Valley Minor Hockey Association.

Emergency Planning Zone Booklet Distribution and Follow-up

An area of 800 m on each side of our natural gas pipeline, for its entire length, is designated as an Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ). Residents, institutions, businesses and industry within this zone receive special information booklets advising them that they are within the EPZ, what to do in the unlikely event of an emergency, and also relating design and operational safety features of the pipeline. Communicating this information to those in the EPZ is a regulatory requirement for any pipeline under the Offshore Pipeline Regulations.

Brunswick Pipeline's EPZ booklet will be delivered in early January, 2009, prior to natural gas being introduced into the completed pipeline. A letter that will accompany the booklet will offer anyone with questions to call the Brunswick Pipeline operations centre for information or for a personal visit. As an additional measure, and beyond the regulatory requirements, Brunswick Pipeline representatives will also visit all addresses within approximately 200 m of each side of the pipeline, January through March, to ensure that the booklet was received and to answer any questions the resident or business/institution has. This will enable us to ensure that the booklets arrived and were retained, that the information is clear and understood. We will use the level of interest in the visits to determine if further follow-up would be of value.

Natural Gas Pipeline Surveillance Plan

A draft surveillance and monitoring plan has been developed for the pipeline. It is important that we have an appropriate surveillance strategy, and we have hired independent security experts to review the draft plan. We will subsequently work through the surveillance strategy with the Saint John Fire and Police Chiefs. This will occur on a confidential basis recognizing the security implications. The surveillance program will be variable and thus not occur on a predictable schedule. There will be daily components.
