

Brunswick Pipeline Launches Targeted Education Initiative

Saint John, NB: Completion of the 145 km Brunswick Pipeline natural gas transmission pipeline, which links the Canaport™ LNG terminal with the Maritimes & Northeast natural gas transmission system, is just weeks away. To ensure those who live and work closest to the pipeline have the information they need, Brunswick Pipeline is launching a targeted education campaign.

The Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ) is an area which encompasses our closest neighbours - residents, businesses and institutions within 800 m of any point along the entire pipeline. Those who live and work within the zone will receive by mail an EPZ booklet containing instructions for the unlikely event of an emergency, company contact information and safety features of the pipeline. Mailing of the EPZ booklet begins today, January 12.

“Natural gas transmission pipelines in Canada have an excellent safety record, and Canadian regulations and standards are considered some of the most stringent in the world” stated Brunswick Pipeline spokesperson Susan Harris. “Establishment of the EPZ and notification to residents or businesses in the EPZ is a regulatory requirement. However, Brunswick Pipeline feels it is important to go beyond the requirements and will therefore personally visit residents and businesses within first 200 metres of the pipeline over the next few months.”

The goals of the visitation program are to ensure the booklet was received and to answer questions. Anyone who receives an EPZ booklet is invited to call 1-888-410-2220 to arrange a personal visit.
