Proposed Detailed Route filed with National Energy Board

SAINT JOHN, NB: Brunswick Pipeline has filed the draft format for its proposed detailed route for the natural gas pipeline with the National Energy Board (NEB).

Once the format is accepted, the proposed detailed route application will be officially filed with the NEB for approval. This application, which includes documents referred to as plans, profiles and books of reference (PPBRs) will be made available for review by landowners and the public through individual service to landowners, public advertisements, local libraries and open houses. It is anticipated that the open houses will be held in late July and early August.

“Where possible, the proposed detailed route has been developed in consultation with affected landowners,” said Nancy MacLeod, Manager, Government and Public Relations for Brunswick Pipeline. “We now need to seek the NEB’s approval of the proposed detailed route. We will file documents to indicate the exact pipeline route that Brunswick Pipeline will be seeking approval for the 30 meter-wide easement within the 100 m corridor approved by the NEB.”

Each affected property owner along the proposed detailed route for the pipeline will receive individual notification. The draft materials filed with the NEB for acceptance on the proposed format for notice documents also calls for advertisements that show the proposed detailed route in the *Telegraph-Journal*, *l’Acadie Nouvelle* and the *St. Croix Courier* newspapers.
