## **Brunswick Pipeline to hold Detailed Route Open Houses**

SAINT JOHN, NB: Brunswick Pipeline will host a series of open houses next week to provide landowners and other stakeholders along the natural gas pipeline corridor with information about its proposed detailed route, which was filed with the National Energy Board (NEB) in August.

“Where possible, the proposed detailed route has been developed in consultation with affected landowners,” said Susan Harris, Community Relations Manager. “We now need to seek the NEB’s approval of the proposed detailed route. We have filed documents to indicate the pipeline route that Brunswick Pipeline is seeking approval for the easement – typically 30-metres wide – within the 100 m corridor already approved by the NEB.

“The open houses will give an opportunity for landowners and other local residents to review detailed maps of the full route and ask questions to us directly. Representatives of Brunswick Pipeline will be on hand to talk with members of the public, and we certainly hope interested citizens will come out.”

The detailed route application includes documents referred to as plans, profiles and books of reference (PPBRs). The PPBRs are also available for public viewing in publicly accessible places including public libraries, City Hall, and Brunswick Pipeline offices. Each affected property owner along the proposed detailed route for the pipeline will receive individual notification and advertisements have been placed in the *Telegraph-Journal*, *l'Acadie Nouvelle* and the *St. Croix Courier* newspapers.

Landowners have 30 days from delivery of their notice and other affected parties have 30 days from the date of last publication of the ads in the newspaper (August 31, 2007) to register any objections to the route.

Brunswick Pipeline will strive to ensure that interested parties are kept informed about the project and our progress.
