Contingency Plan for the crossing of the St. John River

SAINT JOHN, NB: Brunswick Pipeline is inviting landowners and interested members of the public to attend an open house on the contingency “wet crossing” method for the St. John River. Representatives of the Brunswick Pipeline project team and their environmental consultant, Jacques Whitford, will be on hand to answer questions and to listen to the public’s comments and input. As well, information displays and handout information will be available.

Approval for a horizontal directional drill (HDD) method to cross the St. John River was received as part of the NEB’s approval of the corridor on May 31, 2007. However, in the event that the HDD is not successful, a contingency wet crossing plan would be implemented. In compliance with one of the NEB’s conditions of approval, an environmental assessment of this contingency plan must be completed.

“Planning of environmental studies is underway for the area of the proposed river crossing,” said Susan Harris, Community Relations Manager for Brunswick Pipeline. “As well, we are seeking input from landowners and the public with respect to any environmental or socio-economic concerns they may have related to the contingency wet crossing plan.”

The final contingency plan will be developed based on information gathered as part of the studies and from public input, along with geotechnical and environmental data and regulatory input. All of this information will provide a solid basis for responsible pipeline planning for this contingency river crossing plan.
