## **Brunswick Pipeline and Rockwood Park Consultative Committee hosting public workshop**

**SAINT JOHN, NB:** On Thursday, October 4, Brunswick Pipeline's Rockwood Park construction and restoration planning committee will host a workshop to facilitate public input and share initial plans for pipeline construction, restoration and trail design within Rockwood Park.

During the three-hour workshop, committee co-chairs Mike MacIntyre and Ian Stead will provide a formal presentation about the Committee's work to date. Through individual round-table discussion groups, workshop participants will be invited to provide additional insight and constructive input into the specialized construction and restoration plan under development.

"Our commitment to ensure that community concerns are addressed during construction remains a high priority, and we want to make sure restoration activities help enhance park facilities," said Mike MacIntyre, Brunswick Pipeline general manager and committee co-chair.

"The new walking or cycling trail along the pipeline route will be developed to reflect its natural attributes and geography in a manner consistent with existing areas of the park that are now publicly accessible."

A 2.4 km section of the 145 km pipeline route will follow existing power transmission lines through Rockwood Park from an entrance point off the Saint John thoroughway to its exit along Sandy Point Road. During the National Energy Board public hearings process, Brunswick Pipeline committed to developing a specialized construction and restoration plan for Rockwood Park. The 2,200 acre Park, the largest in-city park in Canada, is a popular recreation and walking area for Saint John residents and visitors alike.

The Rockwood Park committee was established to ensure a broad a range of community interests are represented and that construction takes place in a manner sensitive to community, environmental and wildlife concerns. The committee has retained BDA Landscape Architects to develop the overall design for the pipeline route restoration and associated trail development.
